

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Rooted in Family Stewardship

When a family stays long enough in one place, they grow roots that can never fully come free from the soil. ALDER YARROW

It seems remarkable that we have farmed our historic estate vineyard here in St. Helena for 50 years and have now crafted 40 vintages of our Spottswoode Estate Cabernet Sauvignon. While half a century of winegrowing and 40 years of winemaking may not seem all that long by Old World standards, it is a venerable age that gives us a unique perspective on the evolution of NapaValley.

Today Spottswoode is among just a small number of historic Napa Valley wineries that remain owned and operated by their founding families. Our family – the Novaks – became the stewards of Spottswoode in 1972, selling our grapes to other early winemaking families, including the Duckhorns and Shafers. A decade later, and five years after the unexpected death of our father, our mother courageously founded Spottswoode Estate Vineyard & Winery, making our first vintage of Estate Cabernet Sauvignon with winemaker Tony Soter

at the helm. Over the four decades since, two generations of our family have organically and thoughtfully built Spottswoode into one of the most respected winegrowing estates in NapaValley.

Since our mother's death in 2016, what has given our siblings and us the determination and strength to carry forward our family legacy? The answer is based upon our shared sense of love for this

remarkable place and appreciation of Spottswoode's uniqueness. It is also a reflection of our Mom's deep commitment to setting the winery up for continued success. Achieving this required trust, communication, mutual love, and respect, which allowed for open and thoughtful estate planning. Our Mom set a

tone for the five of us, expressing her love of this special place in Napa Valley – a feeling that she passed on, and which we all share.

All of this, and more, came to mind in June of 2022 when we read wine journalist Esther Mobley's thought-provoking article in the *San Francisco Chronicle*, "Why it really does matter when familyowned Napa wineries sell to corporations." Writing about the sale of Joseph Phelps Vineyard, Esther wondered what the cumulative effect of ownership changes would be on the fabric of Napa Valley. While this is an important question, we would like to focus instead on what makes family-owned wineries so special, and why they are worth preserving and supporting. Esther has her own thoughts on the subject:

"I believe there is something unique about wine that makes it, at its core, a business suited to families – to multi-generational families.

There's a simple reason for this. Wine requires land, which requires environmental stewardship. A vintner has the strongest incentive to care well for their land if they know it will be where their children and grandchildren live, and how their descendants make their living. Responsible farming makes better wine; it's also essential to incentivize it as climate change progresses. Of course, corporations can farm responsibly, and many do, but the motivations are different when families are in charge."

As passionate environmentalists striving to preserve the health and vitality of our 140-year-old vineyard for future generations, we could not agree more. Esther's words resonate and ring true to us. Our family grew up on this land, and we have deep, enduring roots

in our community. Since moving here, stewardship of our estate vineyard has been our family's priority. While we and our siblings worked and played in the vineyard growing up, we have always had an amazing team cultivating it. Many of them have been with us for decades, and their health and well-being as they do their crucial work among the vines is deeply important to us.

And of course, there is what we owe the vineyard. Our estate has supported our family in good times and bad. In turn, each vintage of our Spottswoode Estate Cabernet is a snapshot in our family photo album, bringing memories of births, graduations, weddings, and other family milestones. Farming this historic property is both our



responsibility and our privilege, and one we have honored with our belief in being good environmental citizens, including farming organically since 1985.

We believe that as a family-owned winery we have a more intimate relationship with our land than many other wineries. As Eric Asimov wrote in *The New York Times* on August 19, 2022, "… remember that wine is something that comes from the earth rather than from a shelf."



For those of us seeking to emulate the ethic of Old World wineries that have been in their families for many, many generations, this idea is central. Our family has been farming our estate for 50 years. The wisdom and experience we have gained in understanding our vineyard shapes everything

we do as vintners. This is one reason why Aron Weinkauf is both our vineyard manager and our winemaker. To us, these are not separate processes. They are part of a continuity of vision, purpose, and practices that culminate in our Spottswoode Estate Cabernet.

This continuity isn't limited to the work of a single vintage. Though nature can always surprise us, in over half a century of winegrowing we have seen almost every type of growing season.

Our approach is to work with the land, not against it.

We understand how the factors that define one growing season can shape the next, and based on past experiences we farm accordingly. Our approach is to work with the land, not against it. This ensures


consistency of quality over time and allows each vintage to express its unique character.

We embrace the fact that each year brings a new crop, a new vintage, and new opportunities to create wines that express the growing season and the place where the grapes are grown with authenticity and integrity. The result, a body of work expressing one site through 40 vintages, is profound and gratifying.

We believe the remaining pioneering family wineries of Napa Valley are an important touchstone to the history and heritage of this winegrowing region. They are also a reminder of the wanderlust and romance for wine that brought these families here with hopes for a different kind of life, close to the earth and in tune with the rhythms of nature. At the same time, as these wineries have passed from generation to generation, the depth of knowledge gleaned over time has played a key role in continually raising the bar in terms of what we have come to expect from the finest NapaValley wines.

The enduring family-owned wineries of Napa Valley are a reminder that while everything changes and evolves, a dedication to excellence, artistry, and craftsmanship are values that are timeless.

They are also worth preserving and celebrating. With this in mind, on behalf of our entire family and wonderful team, thank you for your patronage. Your appreciation of our wines and enthusiasm for Spottswoode are sources of constant inspiration. At the same time, your support allows us to honor our mission: to be effective stewards of our land and positive members of our local and world community as we work to carry this special family business into the future. Cheers to the next 50 years of Spottswoode!

Recognizing that climate change poses an urgent and existential threat to winegrowing globally, our team actively effects and inspires meaningful change through nurturing our vineyards, communities,

and planet. Today, Spottswoode is regenerative organic, biodynamic, solar powered, B Corp-certified, a member of 1% for the Planet (since 2007), a certified Napa Green Vineyard & Winery, and more.



COLLECTIVE AND MEASURABLE ACTION


International Wineries for Climate Action (IWCA) is a collaborative working group of environmentally committed wineries taking a science-based approach to reducing carbon emissions across the wine industry. Spottswoode was among the first six wineries to join IWCA in 2019, and we proudly support their mission to decarbonize the industry and champion climate change mitigation strategies.

Spottswoode achieved Gold Member status by reducing emissions 3% annually over three years. With the goal of sharing best practices, IWCA member wineries act collectively to reduce the carbon footprint of the global wine industry through direct solutions that avoid purchasing carbon offset credits.

CRAFTING EXCEPTIONAL ESTATE CABERNET SAUVIGNON SINCE 1982

Situated on the western edge of St. Helena at the foot of the Mayacamas Mountains, the Spottswoode terroir is ideal for winegrowing at the highest level. The alluvial clay loam soils from the Sulphur Creek fan provide superb drainage, while cool maritime breezes passing through the gap between Spring Mountain and the Mayacamas range allow berries to ripen slowly.

Forty-two acres of our estate are planted to Cabernet Sauvignon, with small blocks of Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot, and Sauvignon Blanc. We have farmed our vineyard organically since 1985 and biodynamically since 2008.

Originally established in 1882, the Spottswoode Estate has a distinguished history in Napa Valley. Stewarded by second-generation sisters, Beth Novak Milliken and Lindy Novak, our 42 acres are

planted primarily to Cabernet Sauvignon, with small blocks of Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot, and Sauvignon Blanc.

to the health and resilience that organics and biodynamics have brought to our vineyard, the individual attention given to each block contributes to the consistent quality and unique characteristics of our wines.

2020 VINTAGE Our longstanding practice of picking our estate fruit when perfectly ripe meant that, serendipitously, our fruit was harvested by September 26. While our yields were down due to drought conditions, the quality and concentration of the fruit at harvest was excellent. Young and present, this is an energetic and bold expression of violets, lavender, and cassis mixed with dark chocolate, cherry, plum, and graphite. A wine happy to be tucked away in the cellar, and it's also expressing itself beautifully now.

The wine is crafted from our historic vineyard and other exceptional familyowned sites with whom we work year after year. Lyndenhurst Cabernet Sauvignon honors Spottswoode's winemaking legacy and offers our interpretation of a beautiful and dynamic Napa Valley Cabernet Sauvignon.



Created with great care from fruit grown in exceptional soils, from our estate and other growers with whom we work year after year, it is a serious wine with beauty, structure, sophistication, and the ability to age gracefully.

pottswoode's exceptional, classically styled Sauvignon Blanc has been produced since 1984. Highly acclaimed, it is considered one of the "Super Sauvignons," a term coined by wine writer Karen MacNeil to describe a rare class of wines considered to be among the world's utmost expressions of this noble grape.

Crafted with grapes from Spottswoode Estate, as well as those from other iconic family-owned vineyards, this wine is fermented in a combination of French oak, small stainless steel barrels, a clay amphora, and ceramic and

steel barrels, a clay amphora, and ceramic and concrete cuves. It is an eminently drinkable yet cellar-worthy Sauvignon that is energetic

and sublime, fresh and well-integrated, with extraordinary aromas, effortless poise, and remarkable complexity. Noted wine reviewers have written that "Spottswoode has turned Sauvignon Blanc into an art form," and have hailed this wine as one of the world's "best Sauvignon Blancs," calling it the "aristocracy of domestic Sauvignon Blanc."

2022 VINTAGE Pretty and pure with aromas of citrus, white peach, and juicy pear, this beautiful Sauvignon Blanc is layered and complex. Apple clafoutis and floral aromatics invite you in. Rich and textural, this wine perfectly balances viscosity and acidity. Sea spray and salted lemon with some grapefruit pith carries through its long finish. Delicious and refreshing!

2001 DRINK/HOLD

A wine of triumphant maturity and grace which shows itself beautifully now. It shimmers with flavors of dark cherry and orange pith, rose hip, and leather. Silky. A winding forest path over dried pine needles and damp earth with no end in sight.

2002 DRINK

Complexity and balance tie dark plum to baked cherry, rosemary to sage, and tobacco leaf to soy. Consistent, powerful, expressive, and savory, this wine resonates and leaves one enchanted with its elegant and finegrained finish.

2003 DRINK/HOLD

Integration of richness and the aromatic sweetness of baked red cherry, blackberry, and savory pomegranate. A carpenter's shop of cedar dust, burnished leather, and pencil shavings culminate in a stunning black tea finish.

2004 DRINK/HOLD

Still expressive and as fresh as ever, the 2004 vintage continues its remarkable evolution. Ripe dark plum, blackberry-soaked pie crust, and baked cherry form a dynamic base for the more subtle cola, tobacco leaf, and cedar undertones that carry into its finish.

2005 DRINK/HOLD

The 2005 vintage flows from one note to the next, in harmony with itself and with its complexity. Aromas of sagebrush, pine forest floor, and graphite lead to a textural body of juicy and darker red fruits, baking spice, and currant.

2006 DRINK/HOLD

Energetic and powerful, the 2006 vintage is a clean sweep of ripe dark berries, dark cherry, dark chocolate, and black plum. Tobacco leaf, cedar, and gravel notes lead to a firm and tannic finish. Mesmerizing now, it will continue to captivate long into the future.

2007 DRINK/HOLD

A juicy vibrancy carries this mix of red and dark fruits beautifully toward its dynamic finish. Well-integrated tannins with a lovely earthy finish. Cigar box, pencil shavings, and rose petals foretell that this expressive wine will enjoy a great many years in the cellar.

2008 DRINK/HOLD

The age-worthy 2008 vintage was signature of both a cooler spring and our winemaker's deft touch: power with restraint, richness with fine-grained yet powerful tannins. It delights in a simmering tension between red and dark fruits with herbaceous tones full of lavender, thyme, and sage.

2009 DRINK/HOLD

Vibrant and savory, this wine expresses a delicious tension of flavors hinting at a more intriguing future. Dark plum skin and red North Coast cherry, graphite and leather, rosemary and cedar all evolve into a lingering finish. Great tannin structure.

2010 DRINK/HOLD

Precision and energetic gracefulness are hallmarks of the 2010 vintage. It traverses a path of green pine needles, just-turned earth, and crushed violets. A fresh cherry and red plum juice with a herbaceous and edgy finish of black tea and a nice hint of grip.

2011 DRINK/HOLD

This cooler vintage reveals subtle undertones of gravel, rosemary, and fresh thyme reminiscent of Old World wines. A wine with bright acid, juicy red fruits, silky tannins, and herbal depth that is intriguing now, but can age for many more years.

2012 HOLD/TRY

The idyllic 2012 vintage is the epitome of balance. Lavender, cocoa nib, graham cracker crumb, and cedar dust segue to Mount Rainier cherry, blackberry, and purple plum. Its bass notes harmonize in velvety tannins and savory spice. Worth a try to peek at what the future holds.

2013 HOLD/TRY

A drier year yielded smaller berries on the vine for the 2013 vintage. Their more concentrated fruit resulted in a powerful wine full of dense and lush dark fruit with firm yet fine-grained tannins. A nuanced finish of sage, graphite, leather, and violets bring great complexity to this ageable vintage.

2014 HOLD/TRY

A dense and savory combination of ripened dark plum, black cherry, black currant, and mulberry round off with a suggestion of a sweet and floral edge. Layers of clove, chocolate powder, cedar, and toast integrate into a resinous finish.

2015 HOLD/TRY

An expression of the singular beauty of the Spottswoode Estate terroir, the 2015 vintage showcases its floral side with blue violets, tar, and roses. Juicy red plum, cherry, and blackberry with vanilla and spice carry into an elegant and silky finish.

2016 HOLD/TRY

Energetic and fresh, the 2016 vintage is hitting its stride with cherry, blackberry, currant, and dark plum notes intertwining with tobacco leaf, sage, vanilla bean, and spice. This wine was born to shine, and it will only continue to blossom in the bottle.

2017 HOLD/TRY

The resiliency of the Spottswoode Vineyard allowed the vines to hold their own through the challenges of the 2017 vintage and delivered yet another wine for the ages. Cherry, pomegranate, and dark plum are enveloped by notes of cedar, purple violets, lavender, and pine forest. A wine of firm tannin, still young, and poised for growth.

2018 HOLD/TRY

The beautiful weather of a more moderate growing season yielded a young wine full of potential. A silky and creamy thread of blueberry, yogurt, graham cracker crust, and vanilla blends with the juicy darkness of blackberry and plum, which are kept in check by gravel, graphite, and a full tannin finish.

2019 HOLD/TRY

The much-heralded 2019 vintage was warm front to back, blessing us with an expansive harvest. It was a winemaker's dream pick of narrowing down to only the most exceptional clusters. Aromatic and pretty violets linger over vanilla and baking spices. A wine of lush black plum skins, forested expanses, black cherry, and currant, promising to express itself for decades more.

2020 HOLD/TRY
